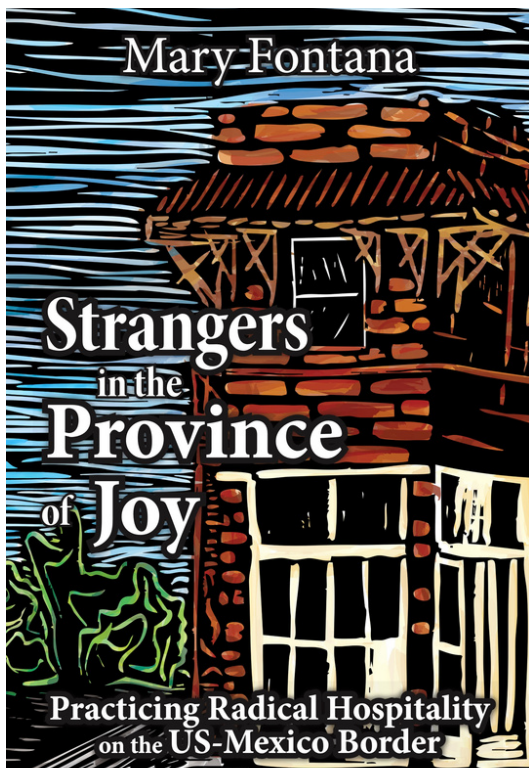


Mary Fontana
